Minutes of the 10th Kelsale-cum-Carlton Biodiversity Group held at Residual Residu

1. Notes and Actions from previous meeting held on 24 September 2018

The minutes of the meeting on 24 September were agreed following the correction of the date of the previous meeting.

- KD and Edwina Galloway had agreed to post redacted minutes of the Biodiversity Group meetings on the PC website subject to the individual agreement of members for their names to be published.
- KD reported that he would be setting up a meeting of the Village Centre Enhancement Group in order to progress actions related to the recommendations from the Conservation Area Appraisal.
- Kelsale Churchyard Management Plan: CB to set up a further meeting with CC,
 JB, (contractor) regarding the annual mowing
 regime. JxB passed CC a copy of an advisory note from SWT on this subject.
- CC to arrange a meeting with CB and (Suffolk Fungi recorder) prior to proposed footpath and hedge works adjacent to the site of the Sandy Stiltball¹ in Main Road.
- Sensory Garden project on the Recreation Ground: ongoing, details still awaited subject to the approval of a budget (CB).

¹ The Sandy Stiltball is generally found on dry sandy banks and is probably associated with elms (including decaying stumps). I would not expect it to grow on hard surfaces such as concrete or tarmac unless there is a thick layer of decaying wood built up on top over many years. This is a very distinctive species but tends to appear mostly in the winter months - CC.

- Cutting of verges: the Biodiversity group had advised that it would be desirable to delay the cutting of certain verges until mid-July or later. KD confirmed that this would require a formal letter from the Parish Council to the relevant persons and that the verges identified should be surveyed prior to the new cutting regime being implemented. The initial list of sites included parts of Butchers Road, the A12 at Dorleys Corner (west side), West View village sign area, and the Village Centre crossroads around Rosemary Lane junction.
- Wildflower Meadow at Carlton Church: the creation of a species-rich meadow habitat around Carlton Church had been proposed and this required further investigation, survey of the potential area, and advice (JB).

3. New OASIS Christmas 2018 edition

The following articles are to be contributed:

- Holly and Ivy wildlife value and benefits (CC)
- Weasels Snout and the BAP (JB)
- Planning issues and biodiversity in relation to the Neighbourhood Plan (KD)

It was also intended to submit a further article about the wildlife species supported by Oak trees locally. CC to provide photos of the Merveille du Jour (moth), Purple Hairsteak (butterfly) and bat species (if available!)


4. Review of BAP sites register

5. Biodiversity Surveys in 2019

The following surveys were proposed in 2019:

- Farm ponds at East Green to be surveyed in March-April (JB to confirm sites).
- Whales Mouth Meadow (subject to landowner consent).
- Laurel Farm (JxB to confirm) subject to consent by owner



- Carlton Park grassland (JB).
- Tiggins Meadow in early June (CC).
